


1. You're All Kinds of Wonderful by: Nancy Tillman


18. No One But You By: Douglass Wood

This story is about a little girl and her mother. The child frequently asks her mother if she would love her through many different scenarios and her mother explains that she would love her through all of the hard time.






20. *If I Could Keep You Little* by: Marianne Richmond


This book is more for the parents in remembering the special moments of watching their children grow up.



21. *My First Book of Feminism* by: Julie Merberg This story helps girls see that they are equal to boys.






24. *The Day the Crayons Quit* by: Drew Daywalt & Oliver Jeffers






